

Hood River County Kingsley Campground Rules and Policy

Check In: After 2 p.m. the day of arrival. Vacant sites may be occupied earlier but sites that were purchased the day before may remain occupied until 12:00 p.m.

Check Out Time is by 12 p.m. the day of departure. Please make arrangements with a campground host prior to 10:00 am if planning to stay additional nights. Be advised the same site may not be available for additional nights.

Site Occupancy and Stay Limits

All sites are subject to a maximum of 6 persons, children under 18 not included.
Maximum continuous stay limit of fourteen (14) days. Maximum 30 days/year total.
Each site is permitted up to one (1) RV or vehicle with trailer and one (1) additional vehicle.
One additional OHV trailer is permitted if all vehicle wheels can be parked on gravel site pads.

Operating Hours:

Campground is open May 1 to October 25th, weather permitting.
Staging/Day Use Area and Reservoir is open when weather permits during daylight hours.
Day-use, Reservoir and Campground areas are closed to the public all other times.

Quiet Hours:

10 p.m. to 7 a.m. daily

Campsite Trees and Vegetation: Live trees and vegetation in the campsite areas shall not be cut, chopped, pruned or damaged during camping activity. No nails, spikes or metal attachments shall be driven or screwed into trees or hardwood brush.

Children: Parents are responsible for their children's safety and behavior at all times. Please supervise children in the campground and reservoir area and do not allow children to play in the roadways.

Visitors must check-in with campground host.

Vehicles: Vehicles must not block any part of roadways, fire lanes or adjacent campsites. Vehicles are not permitted off authorized roads and campsite vehicle pads. Speed limit is 10 mph on campground access road and 5 mph inside the campground loop and day use areas as posted. Hood River County reserves the right to limit the number of vehicles per site. Vehicles are prohibited within the reservoir, reclamation, wetland areas as posted.

OHV: Off Highway Vehicles are permitted on signed and authorized roadways, campground vehicle pads and trails only. OHV are prohibited inside the reservoir area, reclamation areas and wetland areas as posted.
All OHV shall adhere to posted speed limits in the campground and on the access road.

Bicycles are permitted on signed and authorized roadways, vehicle pads and trails only. Bicycles shall adhere to posted speed limits within the campground access road and campground area. Class 2 & 3 electric bicycles are not allowed on non-motorized trails or inside the reservoir, reclamation, wetland areas as posted (motorized vehicle prohibited zones).

Pets must be secured by a leash at all times and may not be left unattended, tethered to utility fixtures, picnic tables, trees, posts, fences, play structures, etc. or allowed to dig holes. Pet waste must be picked up by the pet owner.

Horses and Livestock are not permitted inside the campground.

Restrooms are available throughout the campground. Please see a campground map or host for location.

Laundry: Please do not hang clothes on lines or trees at the campsite.

Screenings: Please do not hang tarps, sheets or screens within a campsite.

Campfires: Hood River County reserves the right to prohibit campfires of any kind, at any time, throughout the campground without notice. Please adhere to all fire restrictions.

Garbage: Please deposit all garbage in the dumpsters located near the campground. Visitors are responsible to keep camp spaces clean.

Fireworks are strictly prohibited at all times.

Metal Detector Use is prohibited in the campground area.

Weapons: Possessing weapons such as firearms, knives, chains, etc. while outside a personal vehicle is strictly prohibited within the campground and reservoir area. No field dressing, butchering or hanging of game animals.

Alcohol: The possession or consumption of alcohol is permitted within the campground and reservoir area subject to all local and state laws, including those pertaining to public intoxication or public nuisance ordinances. The sale of alcohol within the campground, reservoir or surrounding County Forest is strictly prohibited.

Food: Avoid leaving food out of storage containers during night hours or when campsites are unattended to limit attraction of wildlife.

Tobacco: Hood River County is a tobacco-free organization. Smoking and other forms of tobacco use is prohibited in all buildings. During ODF Regulated Use Fire Restrictions smoking is prohibited in the campground, reservoir and forest unless within the passenger compartment of a personal vehicle.

Trees may pose a natural hazard during normal or extreme weather conditions. Hood River County assumes no liability for such hazards or for any property damage, injury or other circumstances that may occur.

Theft/Damage: Hood River County is not responsible for loss, damages or claims to property of guests due to fire, theft, accident or any other cause.

Condition of Premises: No premises shall be defaced in any form and are to be returned to their pre-use condition upon leaving. Any damage by a guest may result in the county seeking to recover costs incurred returning them to their original condition.

After Hours/Emergency Assistance: If emergency assistance is required, immediately call 911 from the nearest available phone and notify a campground host. Courtesy phones are not located in the campground and cell coverage can be spotty.

Right to Enter: Hood River County reserves the right to enter any campsite while in use in order to manage the property and enforce applicable laws, rules, regulations, policies and terms or conditions.
